When you need to buy something, how do you do it? You probably hand over dollars or you might use a gift card you've received. Throughout history, people have used all kinds of payment types, which are even changing today. Ahead, we explore some of the many ways to pay!

BARTER OR TRADE: If you've ever traded something with a friend, you've bartered! Barter, the earliest form of payment, involves exchanging goods or services. While still

used today, modern bartering can involve legal agreements.

CHECKS: Checks, or "drafts" at credit unions, are paper instructions to transfer money. Some researchers believe checks existed even before coins, with modern versions becoming popular in the 1700s. Today, you can even deposit checks using your smartphone!

COINS: Coins are small pieces of metal, often round but not always. Their value depends on factors like size, weight, and design.

PAPER BILLS: Paper money began as written "I owe you" notes to avoid carrying heavy coins. Modern paper money started in China and is now made with advanced technology to prevent criminals from making fakes.

WIRE TRANSFER: Wire transfers electronically send money quickly, often for

large sums. The term "wire" comes from when telegraph lines were used for money transfers.



CARDS: The first credit cards appeared in the 1950s. Credit cards act as small



loans, requiring repayment before a certain date (usually every month) to avoid extra interest charges. Debit cards work similarly but deduct money directly from a checking account.

DIGITAL WALLETS: Apps like Apple Pay and PayPal allow you to send and receive money from a phone or computer. Using technologies like Bluetooth, you can pay by holding your phone near a reader.

CRYPTOCURRENCY: Cryptocurrencies, like Bitcoin, are digital-only currencies not protected by banks or governments. They function similarly to in-game cur-



rencies like V-bucks or Robux. The value of cryptocurrencies can change a lot over time.

- Paper money as we think of it got its start in China.
- A dollar bill can be folded around 8,000 times (give it a try!)
- During World War II when copper was needed in war supplies, pennies were made entirely of steel.
- The first coin we know of is the Lydian Lion. It's made of a metal called "electrum," which is an alloy of both silver and gold.
